### Night at the Races

The following is the player requirements, an explanation of what exactly a “Night at the Races” is followed by the buy-out option for this fundraiser.

#### Player Requirements

Each player will be required to sell 2 tickets for admission into the event. The tickets are \$20 each and include Dinner, Beer and Soda. In addition each player will have to sale/purchase 2 horses at \$10 each. Of course you can purchase additional tickets and horses. We need to sell at least 100 horses.

#### Explanation of “Night at the Races”

For those that have not been to one of these before, this is how it works. There will be 11 horse races. The first 10 races will go as follows. Each race will have 10 horses. These are the horses that you will sell for \$10. As part of purchasing these, you get to name them. Be as creative as possible when naming the horses. No worries, there won't be kids present as this is an Adult only function. The DJ will have someone in the audience pick a DVD to play. The DVD will contain a horse race that he will show on a big screen for everyone to watch. Before the race he will announce all of the horses and give everyone a chance to bet on any of the 10 horses. Once the set time for betting has expired, the DJ will tally the bets and set the odds of each horse to win the race based on the number of bets. He will announce the race with the names of the horses that you named. The owners (those who purchased the horse) of the horse that wins the race will win \$50. In addition any person(s) who bets on the winning horse will win money based on the odds that were given prior to the race.

Race 11 will be an auction race. This means that starting with horse number 1, the DJ will begin an auction for people to purchase the 10 horses. At this time people usually pool their money and horses sell from between \$100 - \$300 +. Once again you get to name your horse. The owner(s) of the winning horse in this race gets half of all of the auction money. So let's say on average each horse sold for \$100. The Total pot would be \$1000. The winning owners would get \$500.

In addition we will sell half the take and can also have Chinese auction baskets as well as other small games of chance. This would require volunteers to work to sell these.

Here is an idea of a ticket that would be quite profitable. We will sell 100 tickets at \$20 each at the event. This is **not to be confused** with the admission ticket. Before the 5<sup>th</sup> race we will draw 1 ticket out of a bag and that person will win \$1000. The Boosters would get the other \$1000.

This is a very fun and profitable evening. When selling the tickets, please do your best to sell them to people who will attend the event and participate. It's more beneficial for us to have people at the event then for people to just give us \$80 for the 4 tickets.

Buy-out option is \$80 – which must be paid to the Boosters by July 14<sup>th</sup>.

We will need volunteers to work at the door collecting admission tickets, taking bets, cooking food, bartenders, selling tickets/raffles. Please let an officer know if you are willing to work. Thank you.
